
This year also saw the launch of J-Kids, where all the Grade 1-3 learners come together for praise and worship. This is so much fun, and all the kids just love this time of the week.





## BPMS learners' Robotics victory dances earn top places!

On Wednesday 31 May 2023, learners from BPMS's robotics team took part in the Interschools Robotics League (ISRL) competition at Pridwin Preparatory School. Learners from different schools were paired and given a challenge they needed to solve and complete with their partner within a time limit. The challenges are focused on different programming and building skills. Learners could not prepare for this competition as the learners only get the challenge at the competition.

Adam Westoby (GRD 4) and his Pridwin Preparatory teammate took first place in the beginner category, whilst Connor Hartlet-Swanepoel (GRD 4) and his Redhill teammate followed in second place.

Mike van Wyk (GRD 6) and his St Stithians Boys' Preparatory teammate took first place in the intermediary category, whilst Izabella Bernott (GRD 7) and her St Stithians Boys' Preparatory teammate followed in second place. There was also a prize for the team with the best teamwork, which was awarded to Chantoné Vermeulen and her St Peter's teammate.

Claiming the second place spots were Ben-Luc Zeeman and Bjorn Aspeling, while Danielle Leach and Fleur Erasmus achieved third place.

Securing the top position and ensuring their names on our brand new Mini-Botz trophy were Ruben de Klerk and Benjamin Hattingh.

The BPMS World Robotic Olympiad Interhouse Competition for our seniors took place on 14 June 2023. The Brainiac category winners this year were Andrea Jooste, Lumi Mhlalo, and Steyn Bronkhorst, also known as the "Third Power" team. Our other Brainiacs were Lea Vorster and Megan van der Westhuizen or the "WROWizardsof Wisdom".

In the Elementary division, "www.pinkpanther.co.za," consisting of Benke du Preez and Claudia Leach, secured the third place.

Claiming the second place in Elementary were the talented duo of Christiaan Kruger and John-Pierre Bosch, known as 'The Doggos'.
