



ROBOTICS



ROBOTIKA: ONS JAAR VAN INNOVASIE

Die gevoel wat jy kry as jy die eerste maal jou robotjie op die Robotikamat neersit om jou kodering te toets, laat jou hart sommer vinniger klop van opwinding.

By BPMS kan jy kies om Robotika te doen as jy daarin belangstel. As jy Robotika in spanverband doen, leer jy vining waardevolle vaardighede aan. Robotika is wel 'n buitemuurse aktiwiteit, maar dit is amper asof dit 'n regte vak is omdat jy soveel leer onder die leiding van meneer Ludwig Ehrke. Jy moet wel kennis neem dat daar 'n lang pad is van die aanvanklike BPMS Robotika proewe in die begin van die jaar, tot by die World Robotics Olympiad (WRO) Nasionale kompetisie in September of selfs die WRO Wêreld Finaal in Oktober!

Robotika bied geleenthede om nuwe vriende te maak - nie net binne jou eie skool nie, maar selfs met leerders van ander skole by die Inter School Robotics League (ISRL).

Robotika rus jou toe met vaardighede soos goeie spanwerk en kommunikasie. Jy begin om aan ander te dink en opofferings te maak, sodat jou span kan saamwerk. Jy leer ook geduld, om jou emosies te bestuur en om onder druk te funksioneer. Probleemoplossing en kreatiwiteit is nog vaardighede wat jy vining onder die knie kry. Daar is ook baie geleenthede om jou vaardighede in programmering te toets, nie slegs die robotjie self te ontwerp en bou nie.

Ons Graad 1 tot 3's word die 'Mini Botz' genoem waar jy begin leer om te programmeer. Die Graad 4 en 5's is die 'Juniors' waar hulle programmeringsvaardighede aanleer en verbeter, maar ook begin deelneem aan kompetisies. Die seniorspan, Graad 6 en 7, funksioneer op 'n hoër vlak in kompetisie verband. Daar word ook voorsiening gemaak vir Innoveringsspanne by BPMS.

BPMS se span, Swoo=osh bestaande uit Neil Robinson, Annabella van der Linde en Mia Rossouw, het op 9 September 2023 'n tweede plek by die Nasionale WRO (World Robotics Olympiad) behaal.

Tydens die WRO "Future Innovators" kompetisie moes studente hulle eie innoverende, intelligente Robotika oplossing skep. Dit moes verband hou met die tema van die kompetisie wat, "Connecting over the water" was.

Hulle idee was om 'n pypstelsiem onder die water te sit om pakkies van een land na 'n ander te stuur. Hulle het besluit op hierdie idee as 'n alternatief vir skepe, wat sleg is vir die omgewing en duur is om te bedryf. Hulle projek skep 'n ander manier om produkte effektief te vervoer na ander lande.

Swoo=osh het 'n pypstelsiem met PVC pype, 'n kapsule en 45° konneksie punte gebou. Hulle het hierdie vervoer meganisme met 'n Arduino rekenaar, actuator (skakelaar) en servo (motor) laat werk.

"Die moeilikste uitdaging van die projek was om aan idees en oplossings binne die tema te dink, en om die programmering taal te leer en te verstaan," sê Annabella van der Linde. Mia Rossouw sê dat hulle span baie goed saamgewerk het en dat elkeen 'n rol in die voltooiing van die projek gespeel het. Sy sê dat die belangrikste element van spanwerk is om na mekaar se idees te luister.

Hul span het ten minste 40 ure aan hul projek spandeer. "Terwyl ons aan die projek gewerk het, het ons baie vaardighede geleer, soos navorsing metodes, ontwerpstegete, programmering, 'n begrip van elektrisiteit, kommunikasie vaardighede, asook kreatiewe probleemoplossing," sê Neil Robinson.

Hulle het gesê dat hulle vir "future innovators" hierdie wenk sal gee: Moenie alles los tot die laaste week nie. Doen goeie tydsbeplanning.

Al was die kompetisie straf het hulle projek 'n tweede plek behaal en hulle het 'n kans gestaan om Panama te besoek, vir die volgende internasionale rondte. BPMS is baie trots op julle!


CULTURAL APPRECIATION

We are sure that everyone is as stressed as we are about the big exams taking place next term! But do not fear, because you can read all about different study methods here! There are different methods of studying. Different people have different ways of studying.

If you are keen on colours and you like to convert words into pictures in your mind, you might be a visual learner. The Visual learning style is when you study by seeing and using visual aids, such as: colours, pictures, etc.

If you are good in sports and need to move around a lot, you might be a kinetic learner. Kinetic learners use movement or "hands-on-learning" to learn and memorize. Kinetic learners can sometimes be mistakenly seen as ADHD.

If you don't like silence, have good listening skills and can remember things well when other people talk, you might be an auditory learner. Auditory learners learn the best by hearing. They focus on listening, speaking and repetition when memorizing.

Make sure that your study method suits you. Here are some tips for studying:

- Always pay attention in class because half of the studying begins there. If you pay attention in class, the studying will not be as hard and there will not be so much pressure.
- Take notes in class. The teacher might say something in class that can appear in the test. Write down the important points that the teacher highlights during class.
- Time management is important. You need to know when to study what. You need to plan ahead. Do not leave studying and projects until the last minute, it will only put you under a lot of pressure.
- Use visual aids, such as highlighters, mind-maps, and sticky notes. This can make an impression on your mind, which helps you to remember things better, especially if you are a visual learner.
- Break up your notes when memorising. Take your notes section per section. If you know the one section well, move onto the next section.
- Your study environment is also important. Research has proven that studying can be more effective when the environment in which one studies is varied regularly, because we make associations with all our senses. Playing classical music (without lyrics) can also be used to make learning easier.
- You have to have a healthy lifestyle. You have to eat healthy, practise enough and get enough rest. Make sure to have a good night of sleep before the test. Your brain needs time to absorb all the information that you studied.
